Nurse Practitioner

Why are we making these changes?

Nationally there is a shortage of GPs and whilst we love Norfolk, many new doctors either do not want to be GPs or do not wish to work in Norfolk/ Mundesley.

When Dr Kemp and Dr Dixon sadly announced they were leaving for personal reasons, we advertised for a GP to join the practice.

As of yet, no suitable GP has been appointed.

What has changed?

Dr Maggio's role is changing to a GP consultant at Mundesley Medical Centre. He will be available to clinicians as required for specialist advice.

This means that Dr Maggio will not routinely see patients, except some complex medication reviews and other specialist appointments.

Our team of Senior Clinicians have the ability to assess, diagnose, arrange prescriptions and refer/ signpost patients.

In recent years we have introduced many new roles into the clinical team to manage our increasing work load.
